Introduction

From the Shakrullapur Punjab province of India, Mr. Sukhvinder Singh is a 43-year-old prosperous farmer. His father, Ujagar Singh, who was a farmer himself, instilled in him a passion of agriculture. Mr. Singh learned from his father and seen the grit and perseverance he put into farming as a child.

Mr. Singh made the decision to devote himself to farming full-time after finishing his education. He leased 6 extra acres in addition to his 22 acres of land. He practiced both conventional farming and animal husbandry on his farm, which included 8 buffalo and 2 cows; from these milch animals he is getting an average 110 liters of milk per day. He also engaged in other farming-related businesses like apiculture, dairy, and poultry, which allowed him, diversify his sources of revenue.



Mr. Singh was constantly keen to learn about new farming methods and cutting-edge farming practices. In order to stay current on farming developments, he frequently spoke with progressive farmers in his neighbourhood and attended Kisan Melas. Additionally, he was a part of The Kharar Cooperative Marketing Society, a cooperative society.



Mr. Singh cultivates a range of crops, including 3 acres of maize, 2 acres of bajra, 10 acres each of rice and wheat, 8 acres each of mustard, 2 acres each of sugarcane and potatoes. He receives a salary of Rs. 2,500,000 per year from his milk source. His earnings from rice, wheat, mustard, bajra, and potatoes are 810,000 rupees, 480,000 rupees, 60,000 rupees, 32,000 rupees, and 22,000 rupees, respectively. He generates annual revenue of Rs. 402,500 from his sugarcane farming. His annual jaggery income increased by Rs. 3,884,160 once he started making it from sugarcane. His jaggery business is now a significant source of income for him, and he has inspired many other farmers to follow in his footsteps. Mr. Singh's path to success was not without difficulties. Water scarcity, fluctuating market prices, and pests were among the challenges he encountered.



He, on the other hand, remained unfazed and discovered ways to overcome these obstacles. To increase his productivity, he invested in sophisticated irrigation technology and crop management practices. He received training in on-farm businesses such as apiculture, dairy, and poultry.
