Farmers in India remain troubled because they are unable to receive better pricing despite the hard work, they put in to yield better harvest. They are unable to set their own prices for their own produce. The necessity of the hour is to form commodity groupings, farmer interest organizations, and farmer federations so that farmers may be confident in setting prices for their produce. A Farmer Interest Group (FIG) is an autonomous group of farmers with a common objective and interest. Members collaborate to achieve this aim by pooling their existing resources, getting better access to other resources, and sharing in the benefits that ensue.

A Farmer Interest Group (FIG) is a self-managed, independent group of farmers with a shared goal and interest. FIGs are formed under every Farmer Producer Organization (FPOs) in order to smooth conduct of the mandates and the objectives set before formation of FPO. The members work together to achieve this goal by pooling their existing resources, gaining better access to other resources and to share in the resulting benefits.

Objectives Of FIG

- Addressing production and marketing challenges.
- Developing self-help ways.
- Providing pooled resources.
- Allowing members to benefit from economies of scale.
- Creating a platform for training and information sharing.
- Serving as a focal point for technical and training initiatives.




Characteristics of FIG

Number of members in a Farmers Interest Group should be 15 to 20. The members of Farmers Interest Group should have the age of above 18 years. The members of the group should be residents of that particular village.

While promoting FIGs, different other community institutions promoted in the area under various government and non-government programme have to be kept in view. The details of such institutions, lessons learnt etc. have to be kept in view while promoting FIGs. Such institutions may include Self Help Groups (SHGs), Village Organizations (VOs) *etc.*, If such groups exist then it is advisable to select appropriate groups keeping in view the objective of the project and then treat them as FIGs.
